Registration for new students enrolling in the 2018-2019 school year begins Monday, April 2nd. We will be registering only **new** kindergarten through 5th grade students who live within our attendance boundaries, or have daycare in our area. Current students are automatically enrolled for next year, with the exception of overload students who will return to their home schools for 2018-2019. Enrollees must provide a copy of your child's birth certificate, immunization records, and proof of residence. To be eligible for kindergarten, children must be five years of age by August 31, 2018. Daily registration hours are from 8:30 to 3:30 in our school office. You can pick up a registration packet on or after April 2nd. On-line registration will be available on April 2nd at www.fpschools.org. Click on Student/Parent tab and then New Student Registration.
