From the Principal:

Dear Midland Mustang Families,

We are fully into the swing of the school year. This is a good time to let you know about our homework policy at Midland. We recognize that homework can be a challenge for students, especially if they did not understand the concept in class. Research shows that the most beneficial homework that students can do is to practice what they have learned. At Midland, our homework policy is practice only. **Your child's homework is to read 20 minutes each night and to practice math facts.** If your child is not yet reading independently, they could have someone read to them! Remember to ask questions such as, "Who is this story about?", "Where does the story take place?", or "what is the problem in the story?". When practicing math facts, you could play a game to see who is faster with basic facts- your child or you entering it into a calculator? Your child should know their addition and subtraction facts (1-20) in the primary grades, and beginning in third grade, your child should be practicing multiplication and division facts each night. Sometimes your child's teacher may send home additional practice on a skill that your child should be able to do independently. We want our students to have mastery over these basic skills, so that they can spend their learning time on the more rigorous skills that are taught in class. Thanks for supporting your student at home!
