

New Sunscreen Policy!

With all the activities that are happening during this time of year, we know your child can be outside in the sun for several hours at a time. Students are now allowed to bring sunscreen to school, but there are several specific rules we must abide by:

- Parents can apply sunscreen to their student or have them apply sunscreen before leaving for school.
- Students will apply the sunscreen to themselves at school. Staff will not be able to help.
- Students are not allowed to share their sunscreen with others because of allergy risks.
- Student's name should be written on the sunscreen container with a permanent marker.
- ONLY rub-on sunscreen should be sent to school (no sprays).
