


Student Enrollment Information

Midland Elementary School, home of the Mustangs, is a K-5 school in the heart of the historic Midland area, just south of Tacoma. The current building opened its doors for students in September 2003, replacing the original Midland School which served the community from 1891-1982. Midland is a growing school, with over 550 students and more than 60 highly qualified and dedicated staff.

Plans for Learning Improvement

English Language Arts (ELA) Goal:

Increase number of students above 50% on CBM (classroom based measurement) by 20% and students meeting standard on the ELA Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) by 10%.

Math Goal:

Increase number of students at 50% on Fast Bridge by 20% and increase students meeting standard on the Math SBA by 10%.

Behavior Goal:

By June 2019, Midland will reduce suspensions of all students by at least 75% (for a goal of 12 or fewer).

Attendance Goal:

By June 2019, Midland will decrease the percentage of chronically absent students to 7% (for a goal of 39 or fewer students).


